- 7. What doe pet sitting/dog walking involve-playing walking, and feeding?
- 8. Will you visit the dog at a regular time each day-how much leeway is there?
- 9. Will you administer medicines, if so, is there a charge?
- 10. Do you have transportation to take the dog for veterinary care if needed?
- 11. What other services will you provide: taking in mail and watering?
- 12. How much do you charge for additional services?
- 13. Are you willing to spend the night in the home?
