I kept him at work for a week and gave him food and water three times a day and all the love and attention I could, thus a bond was made. I didn't want to turn him in to animal control so I contacted N.A.B.S. to see what they could do to help.

Then the folks at N.A.B.S. arranged for us to take him to a vet where he was treated with the necessary medication for his long trip to recovery. I took him home with me where he got the loving attention from my husband and my two female dogs and we became foster parents. Today his tail wags so fast we think it's going to break. The girls have accepted



him as their brother and it does our heart good to see him romping and playing with the girls. He is still suffering from heartworms but is completely healed of everything else..... he looks like a healthy dog should look.

We had thought about giving him up for adoption but felt since the bond had already been made he would grieve and get sick again. We decided to adopt him instead and give him the loving family he deserves..... WELCOME home Buddie!!"



Second Chances

[excerpt from "Shelter Dogs" by Traer Scott]

Here's some shocking statistics that Human Society mentioned about dogs:

- Between 6-8 million dogs and cats enter shelters each year.
- Between 3-4 million dogs and cats are adopted from shelters each year.
- Between 3-4 million dogs and cats are euthanized by shelters each year.
- There are between 4000-6000 shelters in the U.S.
- Only an estimated 30% of dogs entering the shelters are ever claimed by their owners.
- 25% of dogs in shelters are purebred.
- A fertile dog can produce an average of two litters each year, with each litter averaging 6-10 puppies.
- In six years, one female dog and her offspring can theoretically produce 67,000 dogs.

• According to the Journal of the American Veterinary Medical Association, the most common reasons why owners hand their dogs in to animal shelters are:

- no obedience training
- lack of veterinary care
- dog being sexually intact
- dogs having daily or weekly housetraining "accidents."

Friendswood girl works with rescued canines

Esther Segrera volunteers with animal group

Esther Segrera wants to run her own animal-rescue group.

She's going to have to wait a little while, though - she's only 10.

For the past year, the Bales Intermediate fourth-grader from Friendswood has been learning about animal-rescue work first by helping care for the dogs available for adoption through Noah's Ark Bayou Sanctuary Animal Rescue, a nonprofit organization.

The organization's adult volunteers bring adoptable dogs to the Petco in League City on weekends, where Esther and other young volunteers walk them, clean their crates, brush them and help show them to prospective owners.

"We spend time with them, and sometimes we kind of train them a little bit. We tell them to heel and to sit and stuff," she said.

Esther said she's learning skills through her work with Noah's Ark that will help her with her own rescue group.

"Taking care of a dog is a big responsibility, that's for sure. And we've had some dogs that are in bad condition," she said.

Noah's Ark has approximately 15 youth volunteers who provide valuable support to the organization, said Pam Sanidakos, founder of the organization.

"Esther is one of our original volunteers. She's a very mature young lady, hard working and very professional," Sanidakos said, adding that the involvement of young people in the organization's rescue effort is "a huge humanitarian statement ... and groundwork preparation and education for them to be the next generation of rescuers.'

While working with the dogs, the inevitable happened – Esther fell in love with one of the rescued dogs, Reggie, an affenpinscher/cairn terrier mix. She convinced her parents that
